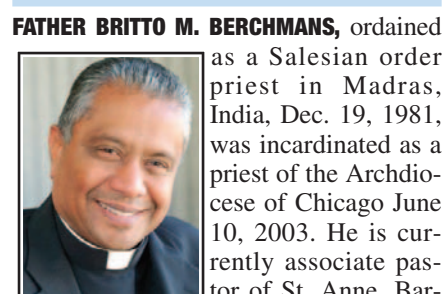
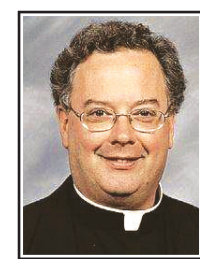

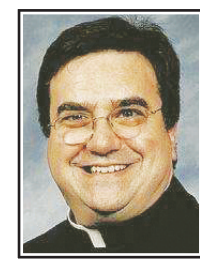
FATHER BRITTO M. BERCHMANS, ordained as a Salesian order priest in Madras, India, Dec. 19, 1981, was incardinated as a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago June 10, 2003. He is currently associate pastor of St. Anne, Barrington. In addition to his education in India, Berchmans has received master's degrees from Marquette University in theology and journalism. 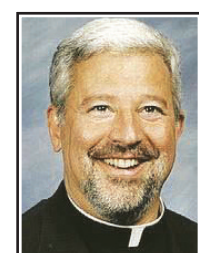

FATHER STEVEN M. LANZA is pastor of

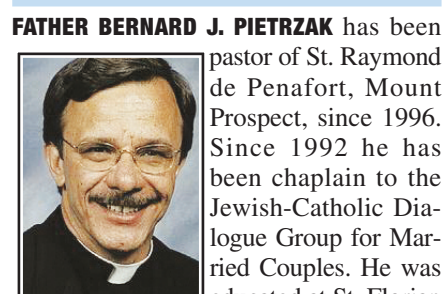

FATHER THEODORE L. OSTROWSKI has been

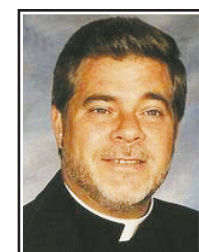

FATHER ROBERT A. STEPEK is pastor of



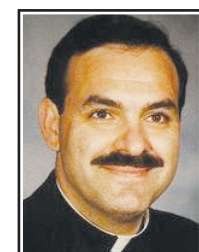

FATHER NORBERT BYKOWSKI spent most of his



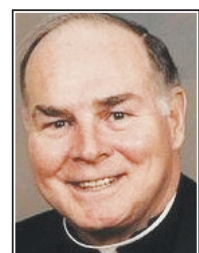

FATHER ALFRED P. CORBO has been pastor of



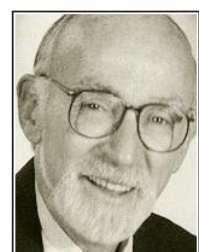

FATHER RAYMOND A. COWELL joined the

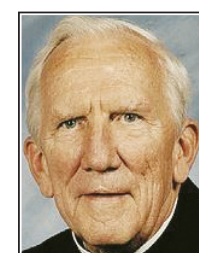

FATHER WILLARD F. JABUSCH spent most of his



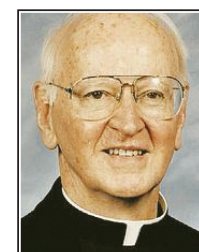

FATHER WILLIAM J. LYONS is the retired pastor



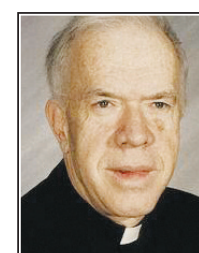

FATHER LAURENCE F. MADDOCK is the director of



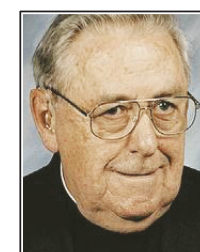

FATHER JOSEPH P. MCGINNITY has served as



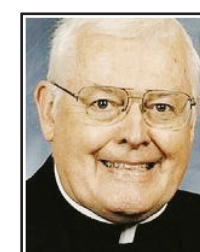

FATHER JOHN P. MCNAMARA was assigned to



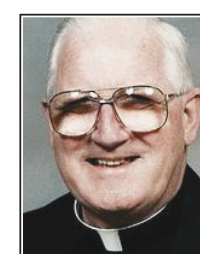

FATHER JAMES O'MALLEY is pastor emeritus of



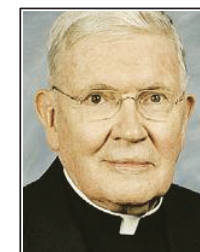
